WSF #4152 Drought Resiliency and Flood Protection

Project progress.

- The City of Lincoln's request to utilize unspent funds to continue similar flood protection measures as described in the original grant award was approved by the Commission at the October 28, 2020 meeting. The actual work that was part of this request was completed in March 2021.
- During the time since the Commission gave approval, the City has been actively seeking reimbursement for these additional flood protection measures as part of disaster recovery funding from FEMA in lieu of making a claim to the WSF.
- In late 2021, FEMA accepted the City's request to include this "mitigation" work as part of the Federal public assistance funding available for the 2019 flood disaster recovery efforts.

Project related activities planned for the coming year.

- Receipt of Federal/State funds is currently pending and subject to submittal of a reimbursement request and a final settlement of funds that occurs during project closeout activities by the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency (NEMA).
- The intent is that settlement of FEMA/NEMA funding be completed by the fourth quarter of 2022 and, if successful, the City may then be in a position to close out the WSF without making further claims. See cashflow below for the estimated amount if a further claim was made.
