• Project Progress

The WSF agreement was approved March 15, 2019. Work prior to December 18, 2018, which included preliminary design services and one land acquisition parcel is not included in the grant. From March 2021 through March 2022, work and coordination on the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) watershed plan continued with additional floodplain modeling. The plan is awaiting final approval by the NRCS. Final design in this period included roadway stub design for 180th Street and Fort Street, as well as coordination with the City of Omaha on access permitting. Access design for each street began in October 2021 and is ongoing. Transmission line relocation was completed in June 2021 by the Omaha Public Power District. One additional land acquisition was completed in this year and two more remain. The project is 20% complete.

Project Related Activities through 2023

Final approval of the watershed plan is expected to occur by December 2022. Final permitting and design will conclude soon after approval. WP-1 construction is anticipated to bid Spring 2023. Estimated costs do not include federal funding.
